ROAD TRAFFIC

The M4 Motorway (Junction 22) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

Made - - - - 9th October 2013

Coming into force - - 17th October 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M4 Motorway ("the M4") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and two of those connecting roads at Junction 22 in South Gloucestershire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M4 Motorway (Junction 22) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 17th October 2013.

2. In this Order –

"the M4" means the westbound carriageway of the M4 at Junction 22 from the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road to the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road and the eastbound carriageway of the M4 at Junction 22 from the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road to the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road;

"the slip roads" mean (i) the westbound entry slip road at M4 Junction 22; (ii) the eastbound exit slip road at M4 Junction 22;

"the works" mean safety barrier re-tensioning, movement joint maintenance and surfacing repairs;

"a works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Saturday 19th October 2013 or on any subsequent Saturday and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the M4 and the slip roads.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;

- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;
- (c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works or for winter maintenance purposes.
