ROAD TRAFFIC

The M6 Motorway (Junction 6) (Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No. 2) Order 2013

Made - - - - 27th December 2013

Coming into force - - 3rd January 2014

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway ("the M6") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on six of those connecting roads in the City of Birmingham, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M6 Motorway (Junction 6) (Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No. 2) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 3rd January 2014.

2. In this Order -

"a slip road" means the slip roads at Junction 6 of the M6, leading from –

- (a) the A5127 Gravelly Hill to A38(M) Aston Expressway;
- (b) the A38 Tyburn Road to A38(M) Aston Expressway;
- (c) the A38(M) Aston Expressway to A5127 Gravelly Hill;
- (d) the A38(M) Aston Expressway to A38 Tyburn Road;
- (e) the A38(M) Aston Expressway to M6 northbound; and
- (f) the A38(M) Aston Expressway to M6 southbound;

"the works period" means the period starting at 22:00 hours on Monday 6th January 2014 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle -

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (c) being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
