**The A46 Trunk Road (Dalby Wolds to Syston, Leicestershire)
(Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

Made - - - - *4th February 2013*
Coming into force - - *11th February 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A46 Trunk Road (“the A46”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that trunk road and some of those connecting roads between Dalby Wolds and Syston in the County of Leicestershire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A46 Trunk Road (Dalby Wolds to Syston, Leicestershire) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 11th February 2013.

2. In this Order –

- “the first length of trunk road” means the southbound carriageway of the A46 from a point 1000 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the A6006 Paddy’s Lane to the centreline of that junction;
- “the second length of trunk road” means the southbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the A6006 Paddy’s Lane to its junction with the slip road leading from the A607 near Syston;
- “a slip road” means the slip road leading–
- (i) to the northbound carriageway of the A46 from its roundabout junction with the A607 near Syston;
 - (ii) to the southbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the A6006 Paddy’s Lane;
 - (iii) to the southbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the B676 Six Hills Lane;

- (iv) to the southbound carriageway of the A46 from Seagrave Lane; and
- (v) to the southbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with Broome Lane near Ratcliffe on the Wreake;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a road marking of the type shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002^(a) and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the marking is placed; and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in a length of the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a suitable surface for the exercise of that right;

"the works period" means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Sunday 17th February 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 8, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the first length of trunk road.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 8, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the second length of trunk road or a slip road.

5. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 8, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in any layby adjacent to the second length of trunk road.

6. Subject as mentioned in articles 7 and 8, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or leave the second length of trunk road at its junction with Old Gate Road.

7. The provisions of articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

8. The provisions of –

a) article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for special forces purposes;

b) articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 shall not apply to any vehicle -

(i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or

(ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;

c) articles 4, 5 and 6 shall not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works; and

d) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle proceeding in the second length of trunk road to or from premises which are accessible for that vehicle from, and only from, that length of road.
