ROAD TRAFFIC

The A38 Trunk Road (Ivybridge to Wrangaton) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014

Made - - - - - *9th July 2014*

Coming into force - - - - - *12th July 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A38 Trunk Road (“the A38”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road at Ivybridge in the District of South Hams in the County of Devon should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A38 Trunk Road (Ivybridge to Wrangaton) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 12th July 2014.

2. In this Order –

“the A38” means the eastbound carriageway of the A38 from the tip of the nosing of the eastbound exit slip road at the Westover Junction, Ivybridge, to the tip of the nosing of the eastbound entry slip road at the Wrangaton Junction;

“tip of the nosing” means the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a trunk road or the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a trunk road;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“the works” mean scour protection to the west abutment of the River Erme Bridge, craned delivery of plant and materials from the A38 and maintenance operations on the A38 eastbound carriageway;

“the works period” means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Tuesday 15th July 2014 and ending when the said works have been completed;

“a works period” means a period of 11 hours starting at 19.00 hours on Tuesday 15th July 2014 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A38.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or remain in the laybys adjacent to the A38.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;
- (c) a vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works.
