ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A38 Trunk Road (Devon Expressway at Haldon Junction
and Chudleigh Knighton) and A30 Trunk Road (Sourton Cross)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

Made - - - - *1st September 2014*

Coming into force - - *10th September 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A38 Trunk Road (“the A38”) and the A30 Trunk Road and their connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on some of those connecting roads in the Districts of Teignbridge and West Devon in the County of Devon should be prohibited because of the likelihood of danger to the public during the Tour of Britain Cycle Race.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A38 Trunk Road (Devon Expressway at Haldon Junction and Chudleigh Knighton) and A30 Trunk Road (Sourton Cross) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 10th September 2014.

2. In this Order –

“the slip roads ” mean (i) the southbound exit slip road of the A38 at Haldon Junction (Exeter Race Course) and (ii) the southbound and northbound exit slip roads at the A38 Chudleigh/Chudleigh Knighton junction with the B3344 and (iii) southbound and northbound exit slip roads at the A30 Sourton Cross;

“the period of danger” means the period starting at 11.00 hours on Thursday 11th September 2014 and ending when the likelihood of danger to the public from the Tour of Britain cycle race is over.

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the period of danger, cause any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip roads.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes
- (b) or proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.
