**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A34 Trunk Road (Headbourne Worthy Lay-by) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

*Made* - - - - *1st September 2014*

*Coming into force* - - *20th September 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A34 Trunk Roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on lengths of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A34 Trunk Road (Headbourne Worthy Lay-by) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 20th September 2014.

**2.** In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A34 Trunk Road near Winchester in the County of Hampshire;

“lay-by” means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions (2002);

“an A34 lay-by” means the lay-by in the northbound carriageway of the trunk road between points 130 metres and 305 metres west of the railway line overbridge at Headbourne Worthy;

“works” mean lay-by construction and all associated work on the trunk road; and

“a works period” means a period of 24 hours starting at 0001 hours on Monday 22nd September 2014 or on any subsequent day until 19th March 2016.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in, or wait on an A34 lay-by.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or

(d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
