ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A27 Trunk Road (Adur Interchange) (Temporary
Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

Made - - - - *15th September 2014*

Coming into force - - *4th October 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A27 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on some of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A27 Trunk Road (Adur Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 4th October 2014.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A27 Trunk Road in the County of West Sussex;

“a slip road” means –

- (i) the road leading from the westbound carriageway of the trunk road at Adur Interchange (A283),
- (ii) the road leading to the westbound carriageway of the trunk road at Adur Interchange (A283),
- (iii) the road leading from the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road at Adur Interchange (A283), or
- (iv) the road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road at Adur Interchange (A283);

“works” means street lighting replacement, road marking and all associated works on a slip road;

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 2000 hours on Monday 6th October 2014 or on any subsequent day until 3rd April 2016.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1.

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
