**The A259 Trunk Road (Various Roads, Rye) (Temporary
Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

Made - - - - - *13th October 2014*

Coming into force - - - - - *8th November 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A259 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be restricted and prohibited on lengths of that road for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16A(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A259 Trunk Road (Various Roads, Rye) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 8th November 2014.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A259 Trunk Road at Rye in the County of East Sussex;

“a first length of trunk road” means the lengths of trunk road known as –

- (i) Winchelsea Road and Strand Quay, or
- (ii) Fishmarket Road and New Road;

“a second length of trunk road” means the length of the trunk road known as South Undercliff;

“a third length of trunk road” means the length of the trunk road known as New Road and Guldeford Road;

“event” means the Rye Bonfire celebrations; and

“an event period” means a period of 4½ hours starting at 1800 hours on Saturday 8th November 2014.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during an event period, cause or permit any vehicle –

- (a) to enter or proceed in a first length of trunk road;
- (b) to wait on any part of a second length of trunk road; or
- (c) to wait on the northern side of a third length of trunk road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs or a constable in uniform, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes; or
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
