ROAD TRAFFIC

The A259 Trunk Road (Little Common Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic and Pedestrians) Order 2014

Made - - - - - *3rd November 2014*

Coming into force - - - - - *22nd November 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A259 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic on the Trunk Road and pedestrians using the footpath adjacent to the Trunk Road should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A259 Trunk Road (Little Common Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic and Pedestrians) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 22nd November 2014.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A259 Trunk Road (Little Common Road) in the County of East Sussex;

“the footway” means a way comprised in a highway which also comprises a carriageway, being a way over which the public have a right of way on foot;

“an A259 footway” means the footway adjacent to the westbound carriageway of the trunk road between a point 100 metres east of Eastwood Road and Eastwood Road;

“bus stop area” means an area of carriageway on the side of the trunk road, intended for the waiting of buses, which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1025.4 schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b);

“an A259 bus stop area” means the bus stop area adjacent to the westbound carriageway of the trunk road between points 24 metres west of Warwick Road and 53 metres east of Knebworth Road;

“the side road” means Eastwood Road at its junction with the westbound carriageway of the trunk road;

“works” means installation of a combined kerb drainage system, gullies, pipe remedial works, construction of maintenance hard standing and all associated work; and

“a works period” means a period of 24 hours starting at 0001 hours on Monday 24th November 2014 or on any subsequent day until 23rd May 2016.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period –

- (a) cause or permit any pedestrian to enter an A259 footway;
- (b) cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in, or wait on, an A259 bus stop area; or
- (c) cause or permit any vehicle to enter the side road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle/pedestrian being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle/pedestrian being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle/pedestrian being used for winter maintenance purposes.
