**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A38 Trunk Road (Branston, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

*Made* - - - - *21st November 2014*  
*Coming into force* - - *28th November 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A38 Trunk Road (“the A38”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on two of those connecting roads, at Branston in the County of Staffordshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A38 Trunk Road (Branston, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on Friday 28th November 2014.

2. In this Order:

| “Branston Roundabout | means the circulatory carriageway of the roundabout junction of the A38, the A5121 Wellington Road and Branston Road;  |
| “a slip road”        | means the slip roads leading –<br>a) to the southbound carriageway of the A38 from Branston Roundabout; and<br>b) to the northbound carriageway of the A38 from Branston Roundabout; |
| “the works period”   | means the period starting at 22:00 hours on Monday 1st December 2014 and ending when the said works have been completed;   |

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle-

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable; or
- (c) being used in connection with the said works.
