**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A3 Trunk Road (Hawkley Road - Ham Barn Roundabout  
(Footpath/Cycle track)) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic)  
Order 2015**

*Made* - - - - *16th February 2015*

*Coming into force* - - *7th March 2015*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A3 Trunk Road (“the A3”), is satisfied that use of a length of that road in the County of Hampshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the A3 Trunk Road (Hawkley Road - Ham Barn Roundabout (Footpath/Cycle track) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2015 and shall come into force on 7th March 2015.

2. In this Order -

“cycle track” has the meaning given in the Highways Act 1980(b)

“the cycle track” means the cycle track adjacent to the northbound carriageway of the A3 trunk road between Hawkley Road Overbridge and Ham Barn Roundabout (B3006);

“the works” mean drainage and associated works;

“the works period” means the period of 24 hours starting at 00.01 hours on Monday 9th March 2015 until 6th September 2015;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall during a works period cause or permit any pedestrian, or person using a pedal cycle with four wheels or fewer and not being a mechanically propelled vehicle, to enter or proceed in the cycle track.

4. The provisions of articles 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

5. Nothing in article 3 shall apply to -

- (a) any constable or pedestrian –
  - (i) engaged in the said works,
  - (ii) engaged in the ambulance or fire brigade service,
  - (iii) leaving a vehicle that is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his or her control, or
- (b) anything done at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform;

and nothing in article 4 shall apply to a vehicle being used for the purpose specified in paragraph (b) of this article.
