**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Folkestone)
Regulations 2017**

Made - - - - 25th January 2017

Coming into force - - 8th July 2017

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Folkestone, Kent by reason of the intended holding of a flying display associated with the Battle of Britain Memorial Day.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Folkestone) Regulations 2017 and come into force on 8th July 2017.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1100 hours and 1600 hours on 8th July 2017 no aircraft is to fly below 4,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3 nautical miles whose centre is at 510423N 0011029E.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a clearance issued by the Folkestone Battle of Britain Memorial Day flying display director.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Folkestone, Kent during an air display for the general public that is scheduled to take place there on 8th July 2017. A large number of aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the display and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the displays for reasons of public safety.

In relation to regulation 3, the term 'aircraft' includes aircraft as classified by Part 1 of Schedule 4 to the Air Navigation Order 2016. It also includes, by virtue of article 23 of that Order, any small balloon, any kite weighing not more than two kilograms, any small unmanned aircraft and any parachute including a parascending parachute.

The times mentioned in this instrument are Universal Co-ordinated Time (UTC), which for the purpose of these Regulations is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

Full details of the Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice To Airmen (NOTAM).
