The Yugoslav Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs to Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy at Belgrade

No. 8860/65

The Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia presents its compliments to Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy and has the honour to propose, on behalf of the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, an Agreement concerning the waiver of fees on visas in the following terms:

- (a) the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia shall waive fees on visas for persons who wish to travel to Yugoslavia and who hold valid passports bearing on the cover the inscription "British Passport" at the top, and at the bottom the inscription "United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland" or "Jersey" or "Guernsey and its Dependencies";
- (b) the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland shall waive fees on visas for persons who wish to travel to the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man and who hold valid Yugoslav passports;
- (c) the Agreement shall enter into force on the 1st of September, 1965, and shall remain in force until terminated by either Government giving six months' notice in writing to the other.

If the foregoing terms are acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs has the honour to propose that the present Note together with the Embassy's reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter.

The Secretariat of State for Foreign Affairs avails itself of this opportunity to renew to Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy the assurances of its high consideration.
