Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between our two Governments relating to Air Services to, in and through their respective territories, which was signed at London on 5th April, 1946,⁽¹⁾ and to the subsequent Exchanges of Letters of 1947, 1948, 1951, 1952,⁽²⁾ 1956,⁽³⁾ 1958,⁽⁴⁾ 1959,⁽⁵⁾ 1960,⁽⁶⁾ 1961⁽⁷⁾ and 1964⁽⁸⁾ modifying the Agreement, and to discussions which have taken place between the Aeronautical authorities of our respective Governments regarding the further modification of Schedule IV of the Annex to the Agreement.

In pursuance of Article 8 of the Air Services Agreement the United Kingdom Government confirm the proposed modifications to Route 4, Schedule IV to read:—

Schedule IV

4. Newcastle and/or Middleton St. George — Dublin

The United Kingdom Government further confirm that, as regards capacity control, Article 8 (i) and (ii) of the Annex to the Air Services Agreement shall apply to the route specified above.

Please accept, Your Excellency, the renewed assurance of my highest consideration.
