THE OVERSEAS SERVICE (MALAWI) AGREEMENT 1971**

Sir,

1. I have the honour to refer to discussions that have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Malawi concerning the continuance of the Overseas Service (Malawi) Agreement 1971⁽¹⁾ hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement" and certain matters related to passage costs, and to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:—

1. In sub-paragraph 3 (d) of paragraph 1 delete the words "one-half of the aggregate" and substitute therefor the word "the"; at the end of that sub-paragraph add a further sentence to read "Passages for designated officers and their dependent families should be, where available by British carrier and, where practicable, by excursion or charter flight".
2. In sub-paragraph 4 (a) of paragraph 1 delete the words "Special allowance" and substitute therefor the words "salary supplement".
3. In sub-paragraph 5 of paragraph 1 delete the punctuation and words ", to the same extent as heretofore,".
4. In sub-paragraph 6 (a) of paragraph 1 delete the words "inducement allowance" and "inducement supplement" and substitute in both cases therefor the words "salary supplement".
5. In sub-paragraph 6 (b) of paragraph 1 delete the words "inducement allowance" and substitute therefor the words "Salary supplement".
6. In sub-paragraph 7 of paragraph 1 delete the words "allowance grant and gratuity" and substitute therefor the words "salary supplement, allowances, grant and gratuity".
7. In sub-paragraph 8 of paragraph 1 delete the words "allowances, grant and gratuity", and substitute therefor the words "salary supplement, allowances, grant and gratuity".
8. In sub-paragraph 12 of paragraph 1 delete the semi-colon and the words "and if" in line 5 and substitute therefor a full-stop and the words "In particular, if a designated officer's appointment is prematurely terminated, or if he should be suspended from duty with loss of pay, the Government of Malawi will forthwith inform the

Government of the United Kingdom through its accredited representative in Malawi and in the case of termination give details of the financial and leave benefits due to the designated officer concerned. If . . .”.

9. In sub-paragraph 15 of paragraph 1 delete the words and figures “31 March 1976” and substitute therefor the words and figures “31 March 1979”.

2. If this Note correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Malawi which shall be deemed to have entered into force on 31 March 1976 and which shall be cited, together with the Agreement, as the Overseas Service (Malawi) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/76.
