Sir

I have the honour to refer to the Public Service (Ghana) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/76⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") and to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:—

- (a) Sub paragraph 4(d) is deleted;
- (b) In sub paragraphs 6 and 7 of paragraph 1, delete the punctuation and words ", grant and gratuity" and substitute therefor the words "and grant";
- (c) In sub paragraph 11 of paragraph 1, delete the words and figures "31 March 1981" and substitute therefor the words and figures "31 March 1986".

2. If these proposals are acceptable to the Government of Ghana, I have the honour to suggest that this Note and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on 31 March 1981 and which shall be cited, together with the Agreement, as the Public Service (Ghana) Agreement of 1971/81.
