Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between our two Governments relating to Air Services signed at London on 5 April 1946<sup>(1)</sup> and subsequent Exchanges of Letters of 1947<sup>(2)</sup>, 1948<sup>(2)</sup>, 1951<sup>(2)</sup>, 1952<sup>(2)</sup>, 1956<sup>(3)</sup>, 1958<sup>(4)</sup>, 1959<sup>(5)</sup>, 1960<sup>(6)</sup>, 1961<sup>(7)</sup>, 1964<sup>(8)</sup>, 1965<sup>(9)</sup>, 1966<sup>(10)</sup>, April 1967<sup>(11)</sup>, July 1967<sup>(12)</sup> and 1971<sup>(13)</sup>, modifying the Agreement, and to discussions which have taken place between the aeronautical authorities of our respective Governments regarding the further modification of Schedules II and IV of the Annex to the Agreement.

In pursuance of those discussions and of Article 8 of the Air Services Agreement the United Kingdom Government propose that the following routes shall be added to Schedules II and IV respectively:

Schedule 11

“ 21, Shannon–East Midlands

22, Cork–Isle of Man ”

Schedule IV

“ 27, East Midlands–Shannon

28, Isle of Man–Cork ”

If your Government agree to the above proposals I suggest that this Note and your reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our two Governments and shall come into effect in accordance with Article VIII of the Agreement.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you, Sir, the assurances of my highest consideration.
