Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the United Kingdom/Mozambique Debt Agreement No. 4 (1993) signed in Maputo on 15 December 1993¹, and to the Agreed Minute on the Consolidation of the Debt of the Republic of Mozambique which was signed at the Conference held in Paris on 23 March 1993, and to inform Your Excellency that the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland is prepared to extend the period of debt relief provided to the Government of the Republic of Mozambique.

Whereas Section 1(e) of the Annex attached to the United Kingdom/Mozambique Debt Agreement No. 4 (1993) defines the Consolidation Period as a period from 1 January 1993 to 31 December 1994 inclusive it is hereby agreed that such Consolidation Period be extended to 30 June 1995 and that Section 1(e) shall be amended as follows:—

the words "... the period from 1 January 1993 to 31 December 1994 inclusive;" shall be deleted and replaced by the words "... the period from 1 January 1993 to 30 June 1995 inclusive;"

If this amendment is acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Mozambique, I have the honour to propose that this Note, and your reply to that effect, shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter which shall be known as "The United Kingdom/Mozambique Debt Agreement No. 4 (1993) Amendment" and which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.

I have the honour to convey to your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
