I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the International Coffee Organization regarding the Headquarters of the Organization, signed at London on 28 May 1969¹ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement").

2. I now have the honour to propose that a new Article be inserted in the Agreement after Article 9(2) as follows:

"(3) The Organization shall be accorded a refund of Insurance Premium Tax and Air Passenger Duty paid by the Organization in the exercise of its official activities."

3. If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the International Coffee Organization, I have the honour to propose that this Note, together with your reply in that sense, shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom² and Northern Ireland and the International Coffee Organization which shall enter into force on the date on which the United Kingdom legislation giving effect to the amendment comes into force.
