**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A494/A550 Trunk Road  
(Queensferry, Flintshire)  
(Temporary 50 mph Speed Limit)  
Order 2012**

*Made* 24 April 2012

*Coming into force* 27 April 2012

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Dolgellau – South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A494/A550) (hereinafter referred to as “the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be restricted by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

1. This Order comes into force on 27 April 2012 and its title is The A494/A550 Trunk Road (Queensferry, Flintshire) (Temporary 50 mph Speed Limit) Order 2012.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means that length of the southbound carriageway of the trunk road which extends from a point 1389 metres north of the centre-point of Queensferry Interchange to a point 325 metres north of the centre-point of the said Interchange.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

3. Subject to the provisions of article 4, no person shall drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

4. The provisions of article 3 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restriction referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

5. The maximum duration for this Order shall be 18 months.
