**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A487 Trunk Road (Cardigan  
Bypass, Cardigan, Ceredigion)  
(Temporary 40 mph Speed Limit)  
Order 2013**

*Made* 11 July 2013

*Coming into force* 18 July 2013

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Fishguard – Bangor Trunk Road (A487) (hereinafter referred to as “the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be restricted by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

**Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

**1.** This Order comes into force on 18 July 2013 and its title is The A487 Trunk Road (Cardigan Bypass, Cardigan, Ceredigion) (Temporary 40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2013.

**2.** (1) In this Order:

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the length of the trunk road at Cardigan in the County of Ceredigion that extends from a point 77 metres east of its junction with the U5005 (Caemorgan Road) to a point 1,114 metres south west of the said junction.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

**Restriction**

**3.** Subject to the provisions of article 4, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit

any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

**Application**

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restriction referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

**Duration of this Order**

5. The maximum duration for this Order shall be 18 months.
