**The A483 Trunk Road (Broad
Street & High Street, Builth Wells,
Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of
Vehicles) Order 2014**

Made 1 September 2014

Coming into force 8 September 2014

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Swansea – Manchester Trunk Road (A483) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in specified lengths of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 8 September 2014 and its title is The A483 Trunk Road (Broad Street & High Street, Builth Wells, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2014.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the lengths of the trunk road” (“*y darnau o’r gefnffordd*”) means:

i. the length of the trunk road known as Broad Street, Builth Wells in the County of Powys that extends from a point 10 metres west of its junction with the A470 Castle Street to the centre-point of its junction with King’s Head Lane;

ii. the length of the trunk road known as High Street, Builth Wells in the County of Powys that extends from the centre-point of its junction with King’s Head Lane to a point 3 metres east of the centre-point of its junction with Strand Street;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means the period commencing at 07:00 hours on 8 September 2014 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition

3. Subject to the provisions of article 5, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed in the lengths of the trunk road.

Suspension

4. The provisions of article 4 of The Trunk Road (A483) (Builth Wells, Powys) (One Way Traffic) Order 1983⁽³⁾ are hereby suspended in respect of the length of the trunk road known as The Strand during such times as the prohibition specified in article 3 of this Order is in operation.

Application

5. The provisions of article 3 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

6. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 12 months.
