# ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES

The A5 Trunk Road (Lay-by east of Llanfairpwllgwyngyll, Isle of Anglesey) (Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2014

30 September 2014

Coming into force

2 October 2014

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A5 (London to Holyhead) Trunk Road (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road") in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) (hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act"), and after consultation with the Chief Officer of North Wales Police, make this Order.

### **Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

- 1. This Order comes into force on 2 October 2014. The title to this Order is the A5 Trunk Road (Lay-by east of Llanfairpwllgwyngyll, Isle of Anglesey) (Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2014.
- 2. In this Order –

"exempted vehicle" ("cerbyd esempt") means any vehicle being used by North Wales Police.

## **Prohibition**

**3.** No person shall cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to enter the trunk road layby situated east of Llanfairpwllgwyngyll, Isle of Anglesey which extends from a point 32 metres east of the centre-line of the access road to St Mary's Church to a point 50 metres east of the said centre-line.
