**The A470 Trunk Road (Builth
Wells to Llangurig, Powys)
(Temporary Speed Restrictions &
No Overtaking) Order 2017**

Made 7 July 2017

Coming into force 11 July 2017

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the A470 Cardiff to Llangurig Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be restricted and/or prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾, make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 11 July 2017 and its title is The A470 Trunk Road (Builth Wells to Llangurig, Powys) (Temporary Speed Restrictions & No Overtaking) Order 2017.

2.—(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means:

- (a) any vehicle being used by the emergency services; and
- (b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and are being driven by a

person for the time being subject to the orders of the member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—

- (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds: or
- (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds.

“special forces” (*“lluoedd arbennig”*) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“the trunk road” (*“y gefnffordd”*) means the Cardiff – Llangurig Trunk Road (A470) in the County of Powys that extends from its roundabout junction with the A483 at Builth Wells to its roundabout junction with the A44 at Llangurig

“works period” (*“cyfnod y gwaith”*) means intermittent periods commencing at 08:00 hours on 11 July 2017 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Restrictions and Prohibition

3. No person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, to proceed at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

4. No person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, to proceed at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

5. No person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle, to proceed at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road

6. No person shall, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle in the length of the trunk road during such times as the restriction referred to in article 5 is in operation.

Suspension

7. Any statutory provisions restricting the speed of vehicles on the relevant lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule are suspended during such times as the restriction specified in articles 3, 4 a 5 are in operation.

Application

8.—(1) The restriction and prohibition in articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

(2) No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to an exempted vehicle.

Duration of this Order

9. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 18 months.
