**The A44 Trunk Road (Pont Dolau
to Glanyrafon, near Aberystwyth,
Ceredigion) (Temporary Prohibition
of Vehicles) Order 2019**

Made 26 February 2019

Coming into force 4 March 2019

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A44 Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is the A44 Trunk Road (Pont Dolau to Glanyrafon, near Aberystwyth, Ceredigion) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2019 and it comes into force on 4 March 2019.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A44 Newtown to Aberystwyth Trunk Road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 18:00 hours on 4 March 2019 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

By virtue of S.I. 1999/672, and section 162 of, and paragraph 30 of Schedule 11 to, the Government of Wales Act 2006 (c.32), these powers are now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers in relation to Wales.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle on the length of the trunk road east of Aberystwyth in the county of Ceredigion that extends from a point 150 metres west of Pont Dolau to a point 100 metres west of Black Bridge, Glanyrafon.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 6 months.
