**The A487 Trunk Road (Dyfi
Bridge, between Machynlleth and
Dolgellau in the Counties of Powys
and Gwynedd) (Temporary Traffic
Prohibitions) Order 2022**

Made 5 December 2022

Coming into force 12 December 2022

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A487 Trunk Road (Dyfi Bridge, between Machynlleth and Dolgellau in the Counties of Powys and Gwynedd) (Temporary Traffic Prohibitions) Order 2022 and this Order comes into force on 12 December 2022.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (*“cerbyd esempt”*) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A487 Fishguard to Bangor trunk road that extends from the western side of the tie in point of the new Dyfi Bridge (approximately 400 metres east of the existing A487 Dyfi Bridge) to a point 200 metres southwest of its junction with the B4404;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 08:00 hours on 12 December 2022 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

Prohibitions

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, on the length of the trunk road.

4. No person may, during the works period, ride any pedal cycle on the length of the trunk road.

5. No pedestrian may, during the works period, proceed on the length of the trunk road.

Application

6. The prohibitions in articles 3, 4 and 5 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

7. The maximum duration of this Order is 6 months.
