**The A40 Trunk Road (Pensarn
Roundabout to Pont Lesneven
Roundabout, Carmarthen,
Carmarthenshire) (Temporary
Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2022**

Made 22 March 2022

Coming into force 26 March 2022

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A40 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾, make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A40 Trunk Road (Pensarn Roundabout to Pont Lesneven Roundabout, Carmarthen, Carmarthenshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2022 and this Order comes into force on 26 March 2022.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (*“cerbyd esempt”*) means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in

connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A40 London to Fishguard trunk road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 20:00 hours on 26 March 2022 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, on the length of the trunk road that extends from its junction with the western side of Pensarn Roundabout to its junction with the eastern side of Pont Lesneven Roundabout at Carmarthen, Carmarthenshire.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration for this Order is 18 months.
