The A470 Trunk Road (Coryton
Roundabout, Cardiff to Cefn Coed
Roundabout, Merthyr Tydfil)
(Temporary Speed Limits) Order
2023

Made 22 December 2023

Coming into force 1 January 2024

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A470 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on specified lengths of the trunk road should be restricted because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾, make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A470 Trunk Road (Coryton Roundabout, Cardiff to Cefn Coed Roundabout, Merthyr Tydfil) (Temporary Speed Limits) Order 2023 and this Order comes into force on 1 January 2024.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means—

By virtue of S.I. 1999/672, and section 162 of, and paragraph 30 of Schedule 11 to, the Government of Wales Act 2006 (c. 32), these functions are now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers in relation to Wales.

- (a) any vehicle being used for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾;
- (b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—
 - (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
 - (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the length of the A470 Cardiff to Llangurig trunk road that extends from the centre-point of Coryton Roundabout, Cardiff to the centre-point of Cefn Coed Roundabout, Merthyr Tydfil, including all exit and entry slip roads between these locations;

“special forces” (“*lluoedd arbennig*”) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 06:00 hours on 1 January 2024 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are removed.

Restriction

3. No person may drive any motor vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 30 mph on the lengths of the trunk road specified in article 2 of this Order.

4. No person may drive any motor vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 40 mph on the lengths of the trunk road specified in article 2 of this Order.

5. No person may drive any motor vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 50 mph on the lengths of the trunk road specified in article 2 of this Order.

Application

6. The restrictions in articles 3, 4 and 5 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Suspension

7. Any statutory provisions regulating the speed of motor vehicles on the lengths of the trunk road specified in article 2 of this Order are suspended during such times as the restrictions specified in articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Order apply.

Duration of this Order

8. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
