**The A5 Trunk Road (Halton
Roundabout to Whitehurst
Roundabout, Chirk, Wrexham
County Borough) (Temporary
Traffic Prohibitions & Restrictions)
Order 2024**

Made 28 August 2024

Coming into force 1 September 2024

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A5 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited and/or restricted because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾, make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A5 Trunk Road (Halton Roundabout to Whitehurst Roundabout, Chirk, Wrexham County Borough) (Temporary Traffic Prohibitions & Restrictions) Order 2024 and this Order comes into force on 1 September 2024.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means—

- (a) any vehicle being used for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾;
- (b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—
 - (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
 - (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“special forces” (“*lluoedd arbennig*”) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A5 London to Holyhead trunk road that extends from the western side of Halton Roundabout to the eastern side of Whitehurst Roundabout, north of Chirk, Wrexham County Borough;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means intermittent periods commencing at 06:00 hours on 1 September 2024 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are removed.

Prohibitions and restrictions

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2.

4. No person may, during the works period, ride any pedal cycle on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2.

5. No pedestrian may, during the works period, proceed on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2.

6. No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2.

7. No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2.

8. No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2.

9. No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2.

10. No person may, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2 during such times as the restriction specified in article 9 is in operation.

Application

11.—(1) The prohibitions and restrictions in articles 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

(2) No speed limits imposed by this Order apply to an exempted vehicle.

Suspension

12. Any statutory provisions restricting the speed of vehicles on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2 are suspended during such times as the restrictions specified in articles 6, 7, 8 and 9 are in operation.

Duration of this Order

13. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
