ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES

The A5 Trunk Road (South of Betws-y-Coed, Conwy) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles over 3 Metres Width) Order 2025

Made 17 February 2025

Coming into force 28 February 2025

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A5 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A5 Trunk Road (South of Betws-y-Coed, Conwy) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles over 3 Metres Width) Order 2025 and this Order comes into force on 28 February 2025.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

"the trunk road" ("y gefnffordd") means the A5 London to Holyhead trunk road at Betws-y-Coed that extends from its junction with the A470 (Waterloo Bridge) south of Betws-y-Coed in a

southerly direction to its junction with the B4406 to Penmachno;

"works period" ("cyfnod y gwaith") means intermittent periods commencing at 00:01 hours on 28 February 2025 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

Prohibition

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle with a width greater than 3 metres on the length of the trunk road.

Application

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
